Why Chronic Absenteeism Matters for Parents and Families:

"Your child's daily, on-time attendance, in school is critical to his or her success in school and in life. It is understandable that some challenges to your child's school attendance are unavoidable, such as an illness or a family emergency. However, it is important to understand the impact of absences from school, especially if they become frequent. *Chronic absenteeism*, typically defined as missing *10 percent (18 days) or more of a school year* – as few as a couple of days per month – can cause your child to fall behind in school. Absences can add up and impact your child's reading, writing, and math skills, which will have a negative effect on his or her future".

#### THE SPRING SLIDE AND THE JUNE SLUMP

Many think of the statewide tests as the culmination of a year of study, yet more than 20% of the school year remains after testing is completed. While average attendance rates per month are fairly consistent between September and April, a troubling pattern starts in May and worsens in June. Across city elementary and middle schools, there is a 5.8 percentage point difference between April attendance rates and June attendance rates.

#### REASONS FOR APRIL-JUNE ATTENDANCE DROP

- 1. Culminating events early in June. ie. prom, graduation, state tests.
- 2. The need to prepare for the next school year. Looking ahead while ignoring the present.
- 3. Post-testing mindsets
- 4. Early vacations
- 5. Senioritis...Yes, it is real.

#### STRATEGIES FOR AVOIDING THE SPRING SLIDE AND JUNE SLUMP

- 1. Work with your student's teachers to avoid a late year slump. E-mail or call as well as monitoring of Parent Portal will insure a strong finish to the school year.
- 2. Reward students that have improved their attendance over the course of the year as well as the students that have met the 100% mark. The HSHS PBIS Team rewards your students with "On Time Rewards" every month.
- 3. Encourage and reward your students to attend after-school review classes. Those that are prepared to succeed, attend more regularly.
- 4. The HSHS PBIS Team also rewards those that go above and beyond through our Positive Referral Program. Encourage your students to make a positive impact on our school community!
